



Nebraska Strong Recovery Project Awarded \$2.2 Million for Disaster Survivor and Community Recovery

In August 2019, the Regular Services
Program funding from the Federal
Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)—
through an interagency partnership with
the Substance Abuse and Mental Health
Services Administration (SAMHSA)—
awarded \$2,234,602 to the State of
Nebraska to help recovery in those



communities most impacted by flooding. The federal grant runs through May 17, 2020, through the one-year anniversary of the floods.

To date, crisis counselors have had **12,417** face-to-face meetings with Nebraskans, distributed **23,000** pieces of recovery materials, and are continually sending **40+** outreach workers to communities around **28** Nebraska counties.
