Flood Safety Awareness

Floods cost over \$8 billion and kill nearly 90 people annually (National Weather Service). Spring and summer have a high potential for flooding in Nebraska due to severe storms and up-river snow melt. See the resources below to learn more and educate others about floods and their hazards, and how to prepare for, respond to, and recover from floods as safely as possible.

- National Child Traumatic Stress Network (<u>NCTSN</u>) basic information about floods and their effects on children and families, as well as readiness, response, and recovery activities to protect behavioral and physical health around the time of a flood.
- National Weather Service (<u>NWS</u>) information about different kinds of floods and NWS advisories; related hazards; and how to protect yourself, your loved ones, and your community in the event of a flood.
- Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (<u>CDC</u>) provides links to web pages and other resources about preparing for a flood, safety for response workers and the public after a flood, water safety, and materials to raise awareness of flood hazards, including a flyer for children, *Feelings After a Flood*
