### SAMSHA Disaster Technical Assistance Center (DTAC) Research Bulletin

A recent (May 2014) research bulleting issued by DTAC highlights the impact of disaster on women. It has long been believed that experiencing disaster has a greater impact on women than on men. Recent research supports that women experience different concerns after disaster than men. Policy implications of this research are noted toward the end of the bulletin, and includes recommendations to address unique challenges faced by pregnant women and caregivers of young children, and to develop greater understanding of the impact of spiritual and religious activities on coping with stress.
